Ramune obtained her Masters in Medical Biology in 1994 at the Russian State University of Medicine in Moscow, and her Masters in Public Health in 2002 at the University of Eastern Finland in Kuopio. In 2010 she received her PhD in Social Pharmacy at the University of Copenhagen. Since then she was involved in several research projects at the Bispebjerg and Frederiksberg hospitals, Copenhagen. In the beginning of 2019 she was appointed as an Assistant Professor at the Research group for Social and Clinical Pharmacy, University of Copenhagen (<a href="https://pharmacy.ku.dk/research/social-clinical-pharmacy/">https://pharmacy.ku.dk/research/social-clinical-pharmacy/</a>), the group which is also a WHO Collaborating center for Research and Training in Patient Perspective on Medicines Use (<a href="https://whocc-meduse.ku.dk/">https://whocc-meduse.ku.dk/</a>).

Ramune's research concerns healthcare services and epidemiology for chronic disease management and prevention, currently with the focus on medicines use. She is especially interested in online teaching possibilities, and in 2020 is leading EIT Health financed project, aiming to develop and deliver the online and blended learning courses for healthcare professionals on how to understand patient perspectives on medicines use.
